- 4. The research papers are to be submitted as PDF files of less than 10 MB & emailed to gitaresearch@bkivv.org.
- 5. The last date for submission is 21 June, 2022 (International Day of Yoga)

TERMS AND CONDITIONS

- 1. The winner shall be chosen on the basis of originality of ideas, and creativity.
- 2. One person can submit only one paper.
- 3. The papers will be examined by a five-member experts committee (See website: brahmakumaris.com/gitaresearch/), whose decision will be final.
- 4. The sponsors will have copyright on all the entries submitted.
- 5. Any participant not following the submission guidelines will be disqualified.
- 6. All content should be original. Research papers with plagiarised content will be disqualified.
